- Fabulous Friday T-shirt

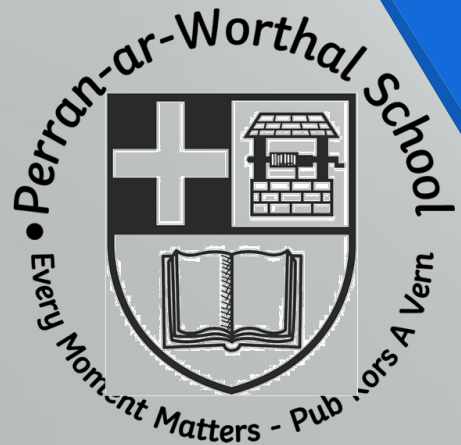


Uniform

Non-logo Items

- Red polo shirt
- Navy trousers/shorts/skirt/pinafore dress
- Red and white gingham dress (summer)
- Plain school-style shoes (black or navy)
- Plain navy/black sports shorts/leggings/jogging bottoms (PE and Fab Friday only)
- Suitable trainers (PE and Fab Friday only)

PE kit must be worn on days your child has PE (see timetable). School jumpers on PE days and Fab Fridays i.e. no sports hoodies/tops/football kit.



All uniform must be named (including shoes)

Extra Uniform Information

- No necklaces, bangles or beaded items are permitted
- A single friendship style bracelet is permitted. Simple medical IDs are also permitted.
- A basic time telling watch is permitted i.e. no watches that can be linked to any electronic device.
- No make-up, nail varnish, fake nails or temporary tattoos.
- A single stud can be worn in one or both ears (Pupils will be asked to remove any items of jewellery that may be seen as a health and safety hazard)
- Hairstyles/haircuts should be appropriate for school and the age of the child and of a natural colour
- For health and safety reasons, long hair will need to be tied back
- Any hair accessories must be of an appropriate size and style for school wear e.g. simple head bands

Extra Uniform Information (continued)

- We expect all pupils to attend school with a suitable weather proof coat when needed. Pupils will still have outdoor play in light rain.
- We stress the importance and actively encourage the wearing of sunhats or caps when deemed a safer option for outdoor play during hot weather.
- Up until Year 5 and 6, pupils only require a book bag, not a rucksack. Please ensure they only have one small keyring, if they wish to attach one.
- No additional stationary/pencil cases are needed as the school provides pupils with all necessary equipment.

Extra Information

- Please do not bring any toys into school. These can be distracting to children's learning and can cause distress if lost or broken.
- No personal electronic devices are allowed on site. If there is a good reason for a child to need a mobile phone for use after school, the parent and child will need to complete a mobile phone acceptable use agreement before a child can bring a mobile phone in. The phone will need to be handed in to the main office at the start of the school day and collected at 3:15pm or at the end of a club, if they are attending one after school.
- Where a child has a medical need for a personal device, this will be part of an agreement through discussion with the parents e.g. Diabetes monitoring device.

Where a child requires access to sensory equipment/tools/objects this must first be discussed with the SENCO, where there will be an agreement on appropriate use, if deemed necessary. If sensory equipment begins to impact negatively on a child's learning or causes distraction to others, the use of these tools may have to be reviewed.

Healthy Eating

- KS1 pupils will be provided with a free healthy snack in school (fruit, vegetables)
- KS2 are expected to have healthy snacks if they choose to bring one to school please
- It is expected that packed lunches include a good range of healthy food choices
- Water only – no fruit juice or squash

We thank you for supporting your child to make healthy choices.

Please note: staff are not on duty on the playground before school and children should not be left unattended.

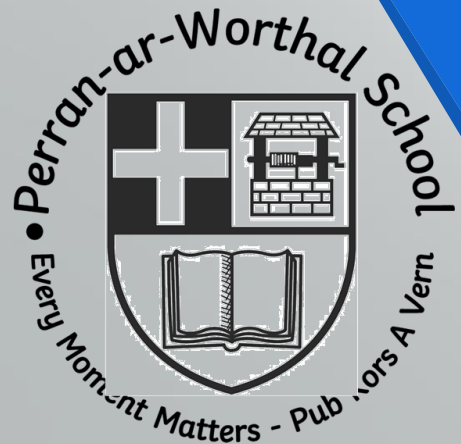
Please ensure that your children do not use the playground equipment or Trim Trail before or after school.

Attendance

- **Lateness is monitored:** If your child arrives after 8.45am they will need to be signed in at the front office and recorded as late. Where regular lateness is recorded, you may be invited to attend a meeting to discuss how we can help you and your child to arrive in school on time.
- **Low attendance affects your child's progress and friendships:** Attendance below 95% is a cause for concern and is monitored by the school, the Educational Welfare Officer and the Local Authority. If your child's % attendance continues to fall, you may be invited to attend an attendance meeting where we can discuss how we can support you and your child to improve their attendance.
- **Holidays during term time:** All holidays will be recorded as unauthorised. As from September 2025 fines will be issued, as instructed by the Local Authority. The school has no choice but to carry out the expected procedure for fining parents for this reason. The school has been instructed to record all holiday absences on the Local Authority System. We ask that you support the school as well as your child's education by not taking holiday during term time.
- **Work with us:** Every child is entitled to a full-time education. We want to work with you to ensure they attend regularly and are in school on time every day so that they continue to thrive, make good progress and to ensure they maintain strong links with their friendship group.

Reading

- Reading Records (5-10 minutes per night)
- Sharing books (5 – 10 minutes per night)

This year, we are trialling not using Reading Records. Research suggests that these are counter-productive when instilling a love of reading in children. Children will still be expected to read/ share a book each evening with an adult and will be encouraged to talk about the books they have read when in school. Our focus will remain on ensuring every child leaves our school reading for their own pleasure at their own level, so reading at home plays a huge role in that journey – thank you for your continued support.

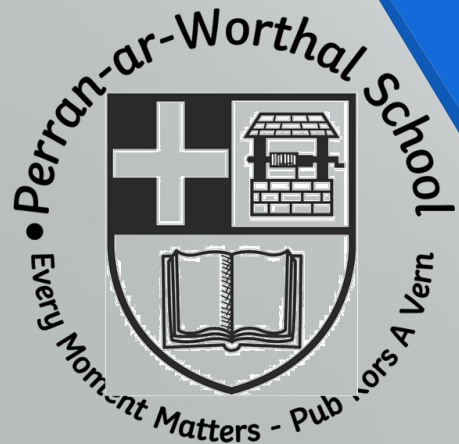
Friday Book Club

A wonderful opportunity to celebrate reading and books.



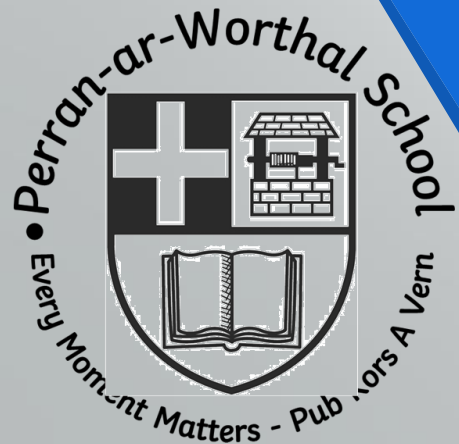
Home learning

Each week your child will complete...

- Daily 5-10 minutes reading
- 10 minutes English
- 10 minutes Maths

Each term there is also a home learning challenge grid which children are expected to complete a minimum of 3 challenges.

Homework is set on Thursdays and due in on Tuesdays. If your child doesn't understand the homework; please contact us before Monday.



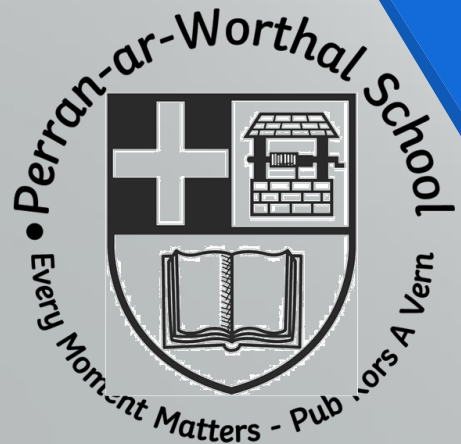
Home learning

Each term there is also a home learning challenge grid which children are expected to complete a minimum of 3 challenges. A copy of the grid will be sent home each term.

2 team points are awarded for each home learning challenge completed.

Challenges can be brought into school at any time or photos sent to our school email address. Please don't send on Dojo as the photos don't download well.

We will share home learning challenges on a Thursday each week.



Lunch

- This must be pre ordered online through ParentPay.
- It is really beneficial for you to book lunches along side your child so they know and are excited about what they are having each day.
- Please be aware that if you have forgotten to order your child's lunch, they will only be offered a very limited choice of what is on offer on that day due to limited portions available to those who have ordered.
- Please ring the office before 9:15 if you have had a problem ordering.

End of the day

- School finishes at 3:15
- Children will be brought to the classroom door by an adult
- If someone different is collecting your child, please ensure that the school is aware before the end of the day (either ringing or sending a Dojo to the school office)
- Children attending wrap-around will be taken to the hall.
- Please contact the office if, due to unforeseen circumstances, you may not be able to get to school at 3.15pm to pick up your child.
- If a child is late being picked up on a regular basis, the school may find it necessary to charge for the first session of wrap-around.
