Parental Involvement in School Activities: Continue to encourage and facilitate parental involvement in school activities, such as volunteering for field trips, participating in school events, and joining FOPs. This fosters a sense of belonging and investment in the school community. 2. Establish a Parent Panel: Establish a dedicated group of solutions-focused parents who provide insight and counsel to the Headteacher and Governors (where necessary). This will be a constructive forum tasked with solving specific solutions on topics pertaining to the school. Topics could include school trip destinations, school extension, resources, behaviour, school dynamics. The panel will provide help the school to craft specific messaging on any issues facing the school 3.
