


Poppy poppy what do you say? Wear me on Remembrance Day.

Women Of Cornwall Music Project

Some of Swifts and Kingfishers were fortunate enough to be one of four schools to take part in the Women of Cornwall Project which was a collaboration between The Writer's Block, Kresen Kernow and The Cornwall Music Service.

We visited Kresen Kernow (the Cornish Archives) to find out more about the role women have played in Cornwall's history. We focused on Ingrid Jacoby who was a 12 year old girl from Austria who was evacuated to Penryn as part of Kindertransport in WWII. She kept a diary throughout this time which gave us a real insight into how she was feeling during this turbulent and uncertain time in her personal life. In addition to the big world events she was experiencing, she also experienced and wrote about things we could relate to such as falling out with friends and starting in a new class. Once we had completed our research, we worked with Angeline Morrison, a singer songwriter, to write lyrics for our song. The visit to Kresen Kernow was generously funded by The Cornwall Heritage Trust.

Back at school, we had 4 short visits from Christine Judge, a music teacher from The Cornwall Music Service who worked with us to compose a melody to accompany our lyrics. Some of us even played our instruments as part of the song.

The final part of the project was the sharing event back at Kresen Kernow (thank you to Bosvigo school for the loan of their mini-bus and parents who provided transport) where we performed our song and heard the songs written the three other schools. It was a great event to be part of and particularly inspiring for those of us who might like to think about Music for our future careers.
