CHANGES AHEAD – As from September 2015, Mr Head will be teaching in Starlings and Miss Shaile will be teaching in Kingfishers. We have also found it necessary to consider the growing numbers in these two classes and feel it is only fair to ensure our two larger classrooms are used for our two largest KS2 classes. Therefore, as from September 2015, our class of 20 Swifts will be taught in the present Kingfishers' classroom and the our class of 30 Kingfishers will be taught in the present Swifts classroom. The class names will be changed over to ensure our Year 6 retain their Swifts' name. Mrs Pallot has given up her lovely large classroom space without too much of a fight as she appreciates the benefits of having a small class of 20. Well done Mrs Pallot for being so grown up about it! Staff will be busy at the end of this term ensuring that their classrooms will be ready for the children when they come back in September 2015. In next week's newsletter, I will share with you our exciting new approach to specialist teaching of our foundation subjects that we will be introducing from September 2015 for our KS2 pupils. This will enable all our children in KS2 to be taught in their individual year groups of up to 20 children for four afternoons a week. This approach will make planning easier and ensure a clearer more focused coverage for subjects such as science, geography and history due to the single year group classes. We are also planning to introduce a Fabulous Friday!!! Watch this space!

OUR FANTASTIC YEAR 6 PUPILS – Next week our Year 6 pupils will be immersed in the National KS2 SATS papers.
