MARINE BIOLOGY? WHAT'S THAT ALL ABOUT? – This week the children had a visit from Ben Holt (Parent Governor and Marine Biologist) and his colleague. Before the children arrived at school, Ben and his colleague were busy setting up a mobile rock pool with live samples of a wide range of underwater creatures and plants for the children to see. Throughout the day the children came into the hall in groups to identify and group common rock pool species, observe and record adaptations of common rock pool species and learn the names of rock pool animals and plants. Words such as invertebrates, crustaceans, molluscs,



echinoderms, algae, exoskeleton where being learnt by pupils from as young as 4 years old! A wonderful experience for staff as well as pupils! A huge thanks to Ben and his team for organising such a wonderful learning experience for the children and also to the parents who came in to help on the day.
