Will Perran-ar-Worthal become part of a Multi Academy Trust (MAT)?

As you know, the Penryn Partnership schools have been working informally together for some years, improving the chances for all the children within our cluster of schools. There are 8 primary schools within the partnership, four of which have already joined larger established MATs. The remaining four primary schools, have been investigating the possibility of formalising their supportive relationship by considering joining together to create their own MAT that reflects the vision and values we all share. The primary schools that have been discussing this possibility include Flushing C of E School, Mawnan Smith C of E Primary, Mylor Bridge Community Primary School, and Perran-ar-worthal Primary School. If it is agreed that this MAT will form it will be called 'Kemeneth' (Community) and it is anticipated that it will commence in the Spring 2018. The schools have asked Marie Hunter to lead the formation of the MAT and the Department for Education has approved the education plan which aims at giving all our children the very best education all the way from 5 to 16. The process of actually forming the MAT between now and spring 2018 is quite complicated but we intend to share all the information with you in a formal consultation period which starts in the autumn, where you will have an opportunity to hear all the plans and have your thoughts and concerns discussed. More information will be sent out in the Autumn term regarding this.

PERRAN-AR-WORTHAL SCHOOL BAKE OFF! – It all started as a gentle cooking session every Friday and has emerged into a competitive, full-on bake-off challenge which our Year 6 pupils have really enjoyed. E-SAFETY MESSAGE FROM MRS PALLOT - SnapChat

SnapChat has been in the news in the recent weeks as their most recent update has included the new 'Snap-Map'. Snap-Map lets users share their exact location with people on their "friends" list in real time. This is obviously a safeguarding concern as it allows people to see the user's location in real time. Yes the location information is only shared those on your friends list...however this friends list could include people children and young people do not know, they could be 'friends' they have met on other apps, online games or websites, or even someone completely random that sent them a friend request that they have accepted. Luckily, you are able to go into 'ghost' mode; this means you won't show up on the map. But this is not the

automatic setting, you must do this yourself. If you require help or advice on how to do this, please visit our





website where there is a downloadable guide produced by thinkuknow. Although the user agreement states that the social media app 'SnapChat' is only for children over the age of 13, we felt it was important to share this advice with parents.

We would however, like to remind parents to ensure their children wear sensible school shoes and not trainers.
