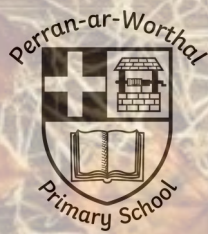

Kingfishers

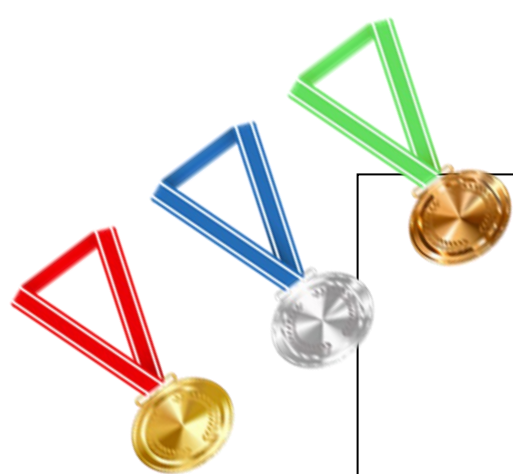
