

### **Mathematics**

Explore a range of patterns made by some numbers greater than 5.

Experience patterns which show a small group and '1 more'.

Continue to develop verbal counting to 20 and beyond.

Continue to develop object counting skills, using a range of strategies to develop accuracy continue to link counting to cardinality, including using their fingers to represent quantities between 5 and 10.

Continue to explore the composition of 5. Practise recalling 'missing' or 'hidden' parts for 5. Explore the composition of 6, linking this to familiar patterns, including symmetrical patterns.

Begin to see that numbers within 10 can be composed of '5 and a bit'.
