Literacy

Provide plenty of opportunities for children to read and reread books to build their confidence in reading.

Encourage children to write short sentences with sound-letter correspondence

Understanding the World

RE:

Being special: where do we belong?

Show the children to see where different people who help us work. For example, to a post office, fire station or library.

If any child has a family member who works in a profession who helps others, invite them in to talk to the children.

Expressive Arts

Set up a crime scene in your classroom. The children need to become detectives and work together to solve the crime.

Provide the children with a variety of different materials to explore. Ask them to decide which material they would use if they were going to create an outfit for a coastguard. Encourage them to think about the function of the material, to keep the coastguards warm and dry.
