Finally, we have a school extension update to share!

After many, many weeks of asking, waiting and still not hearing any real news about progress regarding the school extension, the school was finally invited to a meeting, on Thursday last week, with the construction team, KPK, the Local Authority School Expansion Team and the Mitie Project Manager. Having battled with the difficulties that any building development can have with bats, the ecologist team has finally given the go ahead to proceed 'with caution!' As such, we have been given a start date of Monday, 28th July 2025! We cannot even begin to explain the deep frustration we have felt leading up to this point. Our inability to provide our school community with regular updates has been as a result of the lack of information we have been given. As a staff, we have felt incredibly well supported by our governing board who have worked alongside us to try and push for a speedier process, but the bats seem to have beaten the process, and the progress, every time!

That said, with the start date now agreed, we have exciting times ahead. You have, no doubt, already worked out that the end result will not be ready for a September 2025 start and we have been told that a January completion is more likely. However, we plan to use this time to involve the children in the building progress once they return to school in September. The team are keen to make these moments matter!

On the next page is a birds eye view of the school with its extension. Once the construction team move on site on the 28th July, the red cross thatched area will be out of bounds for the entire duration of the build. Pedestrian access will continue to be through the main pedestrian gate and a safe walkway will be created for parents and pupils to access the school site for drop off and collection (as seen in the solid green area).


Due to losing a large area of our playground, we will be making more use of the lower green area on the school site adjacent to the forest school and grow zone. This grass area is not often used for play times during the autumn and winter due to the weather, however, we are keen to provide the children with the space they need to continue to play effectively. Therefore, from September, we encourage all children to bring in wellies to ensure school shoes remain mud free and dry. More information about use of the playground will be shared in the new academic year.

We are also aware that the staff carpark will not be accessible. To ensure the staff do not increase traffic issues for parents, staff will not be parking their cars in busy areas where parents are likely to need those spaces. This does mean that there should be no change to available parking for parents at the beginning and end of the day. During the summer break, we may receive some updates on progress and we will inform you of any changes to access as and when we are made aware.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your patience and understanding during a period of uncertainty. The children have been nothing less that AMAZING during this time and we are very much looking forward to having the much needed space for our pupils with a beautiful new classroom and the full use of our school hall. We can now look forward to the exciting changes ahead and make the most of the learning opportunities that we will no doubt have access to during the building period.

School Games Gold 2024-2025



We are delighted to announce that we, Perran-ar-Worthal have achieved the School Games Gold Mark Award for the 2024/25 academic year.

The School Games Mark is a Government-led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community, and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success.

Our school has demonstrated excellence in providing sporting opportunities and competition for its pupils, both within the school and in the wider community. It indicates a high level of commitment to developing physical activity and competition for all students.

Perran-ar-Worthal works closely with the Penryn Partnership, which offers an enormous selection of sporting competitions at different levels. 93% of Swifts, 81% of Kingfishers, 97% Skylarks and 100% Starlings competed in local inter-school competitions and sporting festivals this year, as well as all of Robins. We are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of school sport, including those young leaders and officials from Penryn who made our competitions possible.

As part of our application, we were asked to fulfill criteria in the areas of participation, competition, workforce and clubs, and we are pleased that the hard work of everyone at our school has been rewarded this year.

A special thanks to all of our parents for your continued support with leagues, swimming galas, standing in the rain and mud in cross country, transporting children to and from athletics and your support with every event our children can access because of you.


