

INFORMING SCHOOL OF YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE:

Just to remind parents that any absences must be reported to the office. Please do not send any absence messages to the teachers via Class Dojo, email or via another parent. All messages regarding absences must be sent by the child's parents and go through the office. Please could we remind you of the following:

- Ensure you contact the office as soon as possible to inform us of your child's absence—ideally by 9am on the morning of the absence. Messages can be emailed to admin@perran-ar-worthal.cornwall.sch.uk or parents can call the office on 01872863004 to speak to Miss Deakin. A voice message can be left on the answer machine if the line is busy— messages are checked regularly.
- Please ensure you give a clear explanation for your child's absence i.e. include information of symptoms of illness. For safeguarding reasons, all absences are collated on our SIMS programme and must include details of every absence. These are monitored carefully and have to be shared with the Educational Welfare Officer if a child's level of attendance becomes a concern.
- A Leave of Absence form must be completed for any requests for planned absences. These forms can be downloaded from the school website or can be collected direct from the office. Please ensure these are completed with full details outlining the reasons for the planned absence and sent back to the office for review.
- For safeguarding reasons, the office will contact parents if no message has been received regarding a child's absence.
