




PERRAN-AR-WORTHAL SCHOOL GETS AWARDED FOR THEIR ARTS PROVISION! We are so very delighted to share our exciting news having received the outcome of our application for an Artsmark award. Our Submission of Commitment went in just before lock-down and we were finally in the position to put forward our Submission of Impact in December 2022. On Friday we received the email that included the reasons why we were awarded GOLD rather than SILVER! See below some extracts from the Arts Council assessment of our Submission of Impact. Thank you to all involved in making our school such a creative place to learn. We did it!

'Perran-ar-Worthal CP School is deeply committed to the Arts and strikes us as a school that constantly strives to improve on its own personal best. The redesigned curriculum around the Arts is firmly established and the creation of Fabulous Fridays offers pupils a broad range of arts learning opportunities on a carousel basis through workshops in dance, art, drama, music, cooking. Pupils also have access to a range of after school clubs such as animation, art, drama and dance. Often the workshops are led by specialists on the staff who hold the appropriate qualifications or with a professional background in the performing arts.

Through your career-based workshops and, in collaboration with Falmouth University of the Arts, pupils have been involved in workshops on sound and light engineering, live film, stop motion animation, dance and photography. Pupils have then been able to apply this learning by managing the sound, lighting and filming of school plays. There are many opportunities for pupils to learn from artists such as Ben Mark a professional songwriter, Darrell Wakeham an artist working on 3D art form and Neil Waddington from 4416 Film Production supporting the pupils filming the Christmas production. Pupils clearly enjoy engaging in the broad range of arts learning experiences and being inspired to work in the arts and creative industries. It is delightful to read you can see the positive impact of your work in developing the Arts by the improved quality of work produced by the children all around the school and through the Reflection Books.

Cultural collaborations with the community, parents and professionals are a strength and benefit both you and the community you serve. This is great and gives a strong sense of belonging and value. It is wonderful to know you are part of the Creativity Collaborative pilot with Penryn Partnership and Exeter University. Staff will have the opportunity to develop as creative thinkers. As you continue with this pilot you might consider monitoring the difference this is making to your pupils' outcomes within the Arts. Well done on all that you have achieved so far.'

MINIBUS UPDATE! After so many successful fund raising events and generous donations towards our goal to purchase a new minibus for our school, we are sure you must feel as frustrated as we do about the delay in actually taking delivery of our long awaited for vehicle—which would make our many trips to venues and events so much easier to manage! Well, this week we received the email below and we felt it was a good idea to share this with our school community to help everyone understand what we are up against. There is a subtle element of hope in the tone of the email but we will inevitably have to continue to wait for a little longer before we can have access to our minibus lite. We will continue to update you with any further emails we receive. Thank you for your patience and continued support.



Good morning,

Please see the below update for your order J36788 with GM Coachwork, on behalf of Yvonne Hartley:

We are currently awaiting our next update from Peugeot but as of today we still don't have any official news sorry.

The delays all stemmed from the lockdowns originally, made worse by shortages in semi-conductors and parts supply for the entire motor trade. Then further made worse by the Russia/Ukraine war where a lot of components are produced.

This has just caused a massive backlog of vehicles requiring parts in very small supply. For the last 12 months Peugeot have said overseas production is starting to happen but we have only now started to see things moving forward. This is affecting over 700 vehicles we have on order with Peugeot and other manufacturers. I am hoping in the next few months we might be able to update you with some better news. We currently have for the first time in 6 months vehicles in build with Peugeot and I would hope in the next couple of months at least one of yours should be going into build as well. I have nothing official to show that but from what we can see that's what looks likely.

These delays are the same for every manufacturer. The delays are not with us personally. We have an empty factory and capacity to build 120 minibuses a month. This is more than any other supplier in the country and why we are the biggest minibus supplier. No one is in a better position than us. There are companies out their being dishonest about lead times, but they will be in no better place than us.

We thank you for your continued patience and understanding with regards to your vehicles order.




Truro & Roseland Learning Community (TRLC) Art competition 2022/23




Entries need to be made to your school/college by Friday 10th February 2023 at the latest.
