POTATO CAKES ARE YUM! This week the Year 3 children have been cooking potato cakes with Miss Cleaver. A very delicious smell was coming from the staffroom making everyone feel hungry today! Potato Cakes

Main Ingredients (serves 4)

500g peeled potatoes
50g plain flour
1 onion finely chopped
50g cabbage finely chopped
50g courgettes
 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon salt
1 egg (beaten)
a pinch of nutmeg/pepper
50g butter
a little olive oil
1 tin tuna
50g savoy cabbage
50g courgettes

Method

1. Peel and boil the potatoes
2. Mash the potatoes using the butter.
3. Finely slice onions, cabbage and courgettes.
4. Gently fry the onions, cabbage and courgettes in the olive oil.
5. Put the mashed potato in a mixing bowl and add nutmeg, salt and pepper.
6. Add in the fried ingredients.
7. Add in the tuna.
8. Mix well together.
9. Add in the flour and the egg.
10. Mix further.
11. Make potato cakes using extra flour to get the potato cakes to bind and to prevent them from sticking.
12. Gently fry them in a frying pan with a little oil.
13. Eat whilst hot and delicious!
