We use our coloured stones so that children can show us by choosing the colour card to place their stone that best illustrates how they feel at that moment. All our classes use Jigsaw activities to support our PSHE curriculum and, more recently, the teachers have developed wellbeing music and mindfulness activities which are being accessed by all our pupils during the course of the week. These activities are helping our pupils to cope with so many changes they have been through recently as well as helping those pupils who may have worries that they find hard to talk about. Following on from our Healthy Minds assembly on Monday, the children were asked to have a go at designing a poster providing ideas for what people can do to help them when they are feeling worried, upset, anxious, angry etc. This poster is a wonderful example from one of our Year 2 pupils. We felt we really needed to put this on the front page so that everyone can enjoy it.


AND THE GREAT WORK CONTINUES! Our KS1 pupils have been busy learning about China and classrooms and corridors are being transformed into colourful dragon parades.




















Twister is written by Juliette Forrest and was published in 2018 by Scholastic. Juliette lives and runs her own freelance copywriting business in Glasgow.


A uggie and me By Violet.

I would definitely recommend this book to anyone over eleven as younger children won't understand. This is a five star review, especially if you love a heart worming tale...






