enthusiasm and helping our pupils realise their passion and talent for cooking.




## ANOTHER EXCITING SHOW AND TELL MOMENT IN ROBINS

**URGENT REQUEST! PLEASE HELP WITH YOUR CHILD'S LUNCH ORDER!** – Parent Pay has now been running for several weeks and we have received positive feedback from parents. However, where parents have not selected their child's lunch in advance, this makes it uncomfortable for the children when they arrive in the dining hall and their name is not on

the list for lunch which is downloaded from Parent Pay. As a result, staff have no other option but to ask these children to go to the back of the queue to ensure those pupils who have had meals ordered get the meal they have requested and paid for. The canteen staff are instructed by Eden Foods to only cook the number of meals ordered and in some cases where there are several pupils who have not ordered a lunch in advance, it is difficult for the cooks in the kitchen to stretch the remaining portions. Please, please could we remind parents that all lunches MUST be ordered in advance to avoid these difficult situations in school. Meals can be ordered for a whole week or more in advance if it is easier for parents to plan their child's meals throughout the week. We thank you for your support with this.
