How to...

Fronted Adverbials

Sometimes an adverb or adverbial phrase can come before the verb instead of after.

Tom rode his bike like an expert.

Could be changed to:

Like an expert, Tom rode his bike.

A comma always comes after a fronted adverbial.

Here are some more examples...

Above the clouds, Below the sea, As quick as a flash, Without a sound, Unfortunately, In the blink of an eye, Before long, Barely alive, Unexpectedly, Suddenly,
