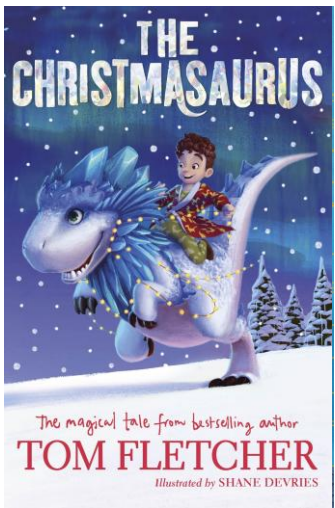


Why this?

The Year 2s study dealing with change in Jigsaw and problem solving in Skills Builder.

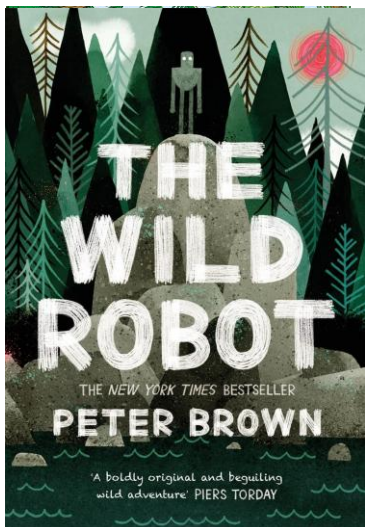


Why this?

The Year 2s study stereotyping and diversity in their Jigsaw lessons.

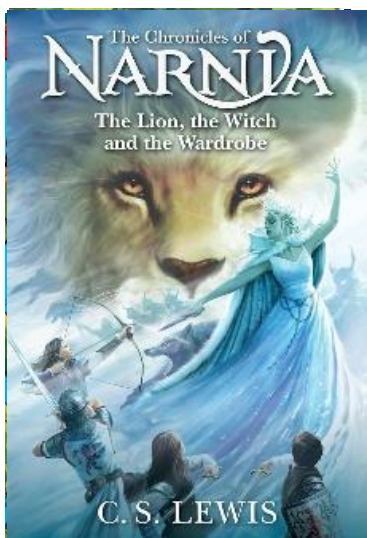


Why this?

The Year 2s learn about the sense of belonging in their Jigsaw lessons.

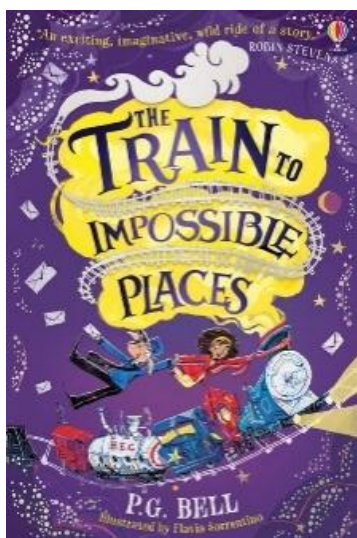


Why this?

The Year 2s explore the use of imagination within Creativity in their Skills Builder sessions.

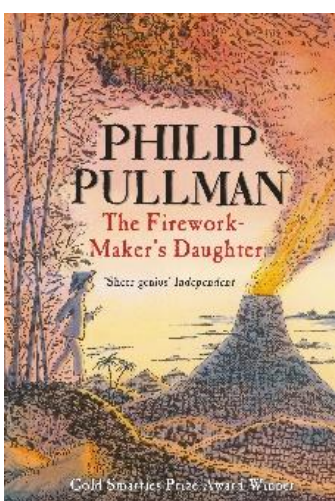


Why this?
