This meant that each pupil needed to run an average of 25Km per week! The enthusiasm for this wor-thy cause generated quite a lot of interest by others and soon, the original team of 6 were joined by a further 2 Year 6 pupils, seen here in their super hero outfits on the day they completed their final run. 

....and then there's the Naughty Elf in Robins...







