

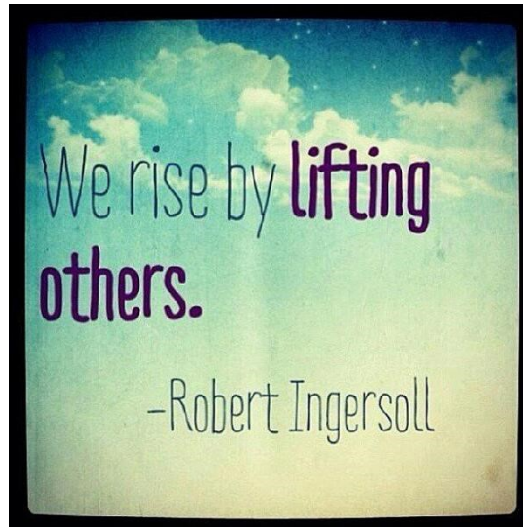

Have you got what it takes to solve this malodourous misdeed?

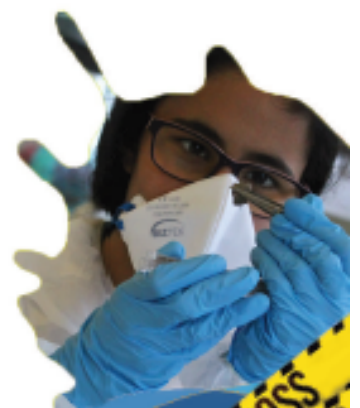
