Year 2 pupil Daisy of Perran ar Worthal School created a poster with an amazingly simple but extremely effective message of "RESPECT EVERYONE". We at Stay Safe felt that this was a winner for us, as it sums up the theme behind Anti-bullying week and is certainly a message lots of us out there can learn a lot from. It's also a message we re-iterate several times throughout our work with young people.

Richard Pomfrett (Founder of Stay Safe Workshops) was delighted to be able to visit Perran-ar -Worthal school on Wednesday 23rd of Jan and present the prize and certificate to Daisy in person. This presentation took place infront of the whole school as well school governor's and proud members of Daisy's family. We were also happy to treat the whole school to one of our Anti-bullying assemblies.

Due to the volume of posters we received, it was great to see just how many children understand the importance of choosing and showing respect. And while we live in times where some find it so easy to do the opposite, we are hopeful that the young people of today can lead the way and show respect both in their own community's, in school and online. A bit about us and our work:




