THE EDUCATIONAL WELFARE OFFICER HAS VISITED – Yesterday, the EWO carried out her termly pupil attendance monitoring visit. As a school we were congratulated for our high percentage of pupil attendance with an average attendance of 97.2%. Thank you for your support with ensuring your child attends school regularly and does not take holiday during term time. However, for the small minority of pupils whose attendance has dropped below 90%, parents will be receiving a letter from the EWO in due course as a large number of lost hours of learning can have a major impact on your child's progress. As I am sure you are aware, we are also required to monitor time of arrival for pupils who may have a pattern of lateness. Arriving on time ensures your child is settled and ready to begin their lessons for the day. Just as a reminder – classroom doors are unlocked at 8.45am when teachers are ready to receive the children. Classroom doors are then locked at 9am. Any pupils arriving after 9am can only enter the school building via the school office where they must be signed in and a reason for lateness given. Thank you for your continued support with a prompt start to your child's learning each day.

PARKING ISSUES FOR SPRING CONCERT ON SATURDAY – We are very much looking forward to the Spring

Concert at the Village Hall on Saturday, 25th March at 5.30pm followed by a BBQ. However, we are concerned about the number of vehicles that will be arriving for this event on a day and at a time when there is a football match taking place on the village green. Please can we ask you to bear this in mind when attending this event tomorrow night? If you are able to walk to the event, travel with friends or be dropped off by a family taxi service, this would certainly help to reduce the congestion and lack of parking. The adult choir have been given permission to park at the school in an effort to enable more parents and relatives to park their cars on the road and at the village hall, if any spaces are available. Please can we also remind parents to keep your children close to you at all times, especially when in the carpark, due to the number of vehicles that may be arriving, leaving and moving about. This is not an event where children taking part can be dropped off and left without adult supervision. Before and after the concert the children will be the responsibility of the adult who is accompanying them to the event. Pupils taking part have been given a school tie today to wear with their long sleeved white shirt at the concert. Please could we ask that all pupils taking part arrive at the village hall no later than 5.15pm and come straight in to the hall where they will be met by myself, Mrs Whomersley and Mr Collett.
