- <u>Preparing the bamboo handles for the lantern parade</u> strong hands needed for this job Dads, but you may get a cuppa and a biscuit while you work!
- <u>Working with a group of four children to create a lantern for our parade</u> this will be an all day event (Thursday, 30th November) but you can choose to do just a morning or afternoon if you prefer. Old clothes and shoes will be essential as you will get very sticky LOTS of glue involved!
- <u>Decorating 20 black T-shirts for our KS1 pupils to wear for their role as STARS</u> *be creative and have fun with a bit of sparkle decorating 20 shirts to look the same.*
- <u>Sewing green tinsel onto 20 white T-shirts for our KS1 narrators to wear</u> *if you're handy with a needle and thread and would like to sit and chat with a group of parents while you create, then come along and join in the fun.*
- <u>Running a stall</u> *if you can spare half an hour to take turns in running one of our Christmas stalls, Santa's grotto, Christmas BBQ, coffee shop etc then please sign up.*
- <u>Setting Up and Packing Down</u> this is something that we need as many hands on deck as we possibly can, this will include positioning tables for stall holder, decorating the playground with lights, Christmas Tree, staging (if needed) etc. and then putting it all away again at the end of the evening.

Christmas Fayre, Thursday, 7th December. The fayre will officially open at approximately 6.45pm once the school nativity and lantern procession has finished (start time 6pm). There will be lots happening around the school including, meet santa in his grotto, lots of stalls where you can do some essential Christmas shopping, tombola, games, refreshments will be available to purchase, BBQ selling locally sourced quality hotdogs and burgers – always very popular, cake stall and lots more.

We are planning to run a quality second hand toys and book stall, so if you are having a pre-Christmas de-clutter, we would be grateful if you could bring items in during the week of the fayre.
