Any parent of a child from Reception to Year 6 that is eligible and has their claim approved by County Hall, will be entitled to claim for other benefits including free school trips, clubs etc (at the moment the school is prepared to pay for clubs such as Go-Active on your behalf. There may also be other benefits available). Your application will be processed within 3 working days (normally the same day if submitted before 12noon), whereas paper applications may take up to 10 working days to process.

If you are in receipt of one or more of the benefits listed (see right) and you do not receive Working Tax Credits, please complete the application form below. If unsure, please contact the School Meals Team on 01872 323298 or email <a href="mailto:schoolmeals@cornwall.gov.uk">schoolmeals@cornwall.gov.uk</a> - the team will be able to check your entitlement to claim.

From September 2014, all Key Stage 1 children (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) are eligible to receive free school meals. However, if you are in receipt of one or more of the benefits listed (see right) and you do not receive Working Tax Credits, your child's school could benefit from Pupil Premium funding to support your child just by filling in this application form.
