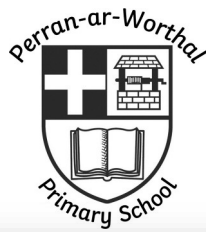

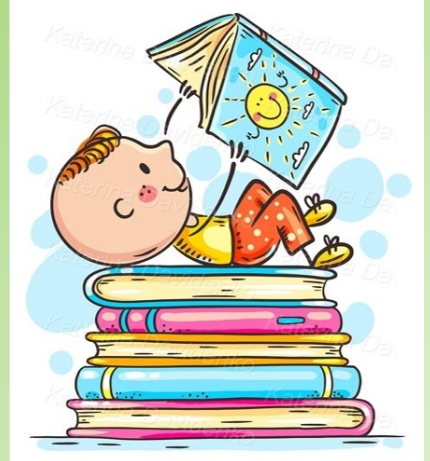

EYFS



In EYFS, we plan to deliver a balanced literacy curriculum that incorporates a carefully selected range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts from diverse cultures. These texts are closely aligned with our half-termly topics and provide the foundation for our literacy teaching. In line with the principles outlined in 'Development Matters', we maintain flexibility in our planning to support the 'unique child' principle. While the selected texts serve as our starting point, we actively follow children's interests and respond to their individual needs. When introducing each new topic, we encourage families to share related books from home, enriching our curriculum and strengthening the home-school partnership in supporting children's literacy development.



Perran-ar-Worthal Book Club

We are dedicated to inspire and promote a love for reading.

When?

Book Club will be on a Monday and Friday morning.

Why?

Making sure that children become engaged with reading is one of the most important ways to make a difference to their life chances.

How?

We aim to inspire and promote reading through the following core strategies in our Book Club:

1

Teachers can read selected books aloud.
In KS2, these texts can also link to reading comprehension sessions.

2

Children engage in informal 'book talk'. This includes discussing recommendations with peers and teachers.

3

Teachers encourage library use and ensure that a range of texts are selected.

4

Teachers provide dedicated time to read.

5

Teachers reward the habit of reading through the regular monitoring of Reading Records.
Teachers recognise that motivation is driven by curiosity, engagement and familiarity.
