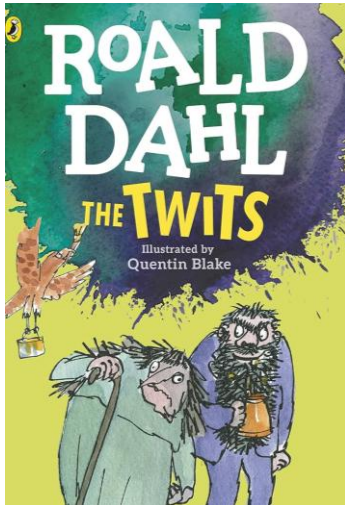


Why this?

The Year 3s study conflict, being a bystander and consequences in their Jigsaw lessons.

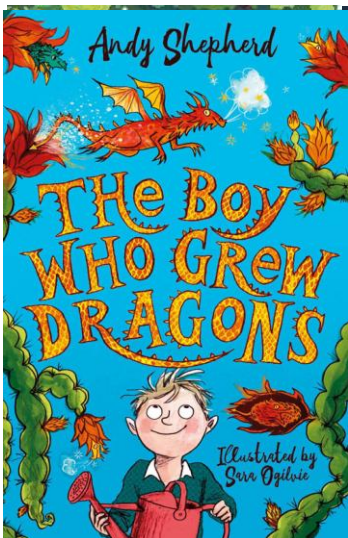


Why this?

The Year 3s learn about dreams, ambitions and challenges in their Jigsaw lessons.

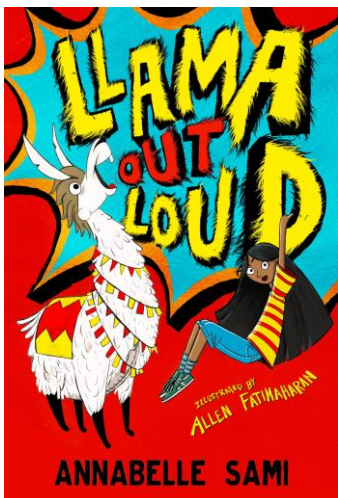


Why this?

The Year 3s learn about taking responsibility and problem solving in Skills Builder and Jigsaw.

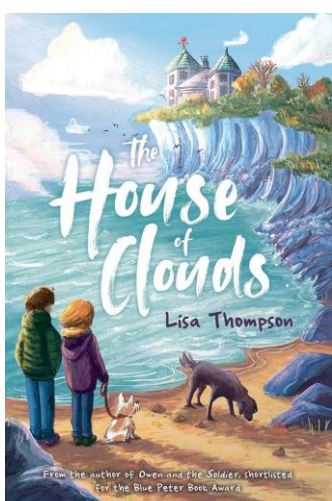


Why this?
