NOTE FROM INTERSERVE CATERING RE INCREASE IN LUNCH PRICES:

Paid school meals prices are to increase from September 2017. This will mean an increase from £2.25 per meal to £2.30. This is the first increase in the price of a school lunch for two years and means just a 5 pence increase or an additional 25 pence per week, which we believe still represents excellent value for money. This increase is a result of rising food and ingredient prices the same as we have all experienced in our household shopping baskets.

We are passionate about providing your child with the best start in life by providing them with a nutritious and tasty two course lunch each day. Over 85% of our meals are cooked from scratch in your schools' production kitchen using seasonal, fresh, quality ingredients; our meat is British, Red Tractor Farm Assured Accredited; our fish is from sustainable sources; our eggs are free range and local and our fruit and vegetables are locally sourced.

Our meals all contain at least two portions of the five a day recommended intake of fruit and vegetables. Based on these credentials, we have been awarded the Gold Food for Life Accreditation from the Soil Association, who continually monitor and audit our service.

We hope that those families who pay for their child's school lunch will understand and continue to support the service that we know offers fantastic choice, great value for money and helps children be ready to learn.
