The children at Perran-ar-Worthal engaged in a 'Black History Morning' this week as part of Black History Month.

As the theme is 'Reclaiming Narratives', the assembly explained the concept and the significance of how individuals are reclaiming their narrative:


This year's Black History Month theme, Reclaiming Narratives, marks a powerful shift in how we view and celebrate Black history and culture.

It's about challenging the narratives that have historically marginalised Black achievements and instead highlighting stories of resilience, success, and empowerment.

So what did our children focus on?

#### **Puffins**

In EYFS, the children explored the text 'We Are All Different' which promotes the beauty of diversity and celebrates differences. It also introduces children to the concept of being equal.



#### Wagtails

In Year 1, the children learned about Betty Campbell, the first black headteacher in Wales. As well as being a teacher Betty was also an important influence in establishing Black History Month in the UK.

#### Robins

In Year 2, the children learned about Olaudah Equiano who spoke out against the English slave trade. He also worked to resettle freed slaves.



#### Starlings

In Year 3, the children learned about Rosa Parks, an American activist in the civil rights movement, best known for her pivotal role in the Montgomery bus boycott.



In Year 4, the children engaged in several activities that required them to seek information about specific individuals before discussing the significance of taking part in Black History Month.



#### Kingfishers

In Year 5, the children learned about Mary Seacole who is known for her medical work in the Crimean war, and as a brilliant woman who combated the racial prejudice she experienced in her lifetime.



In Year 6, the children learned about Serena Williams (one of the greatest athletes of all time) and explored how she reclaimed her own narrative.







We are very excited to share with you that, this term, we have introduced our pupils to the Skills Builder Programme as part of our Skills Builder Partnership. Over the last three weeks, our pupils have been focusing on the
