YEAR 6 LEARN ABOUT THE LAW FROM THOSE THAT KNOW BEST! This term our Year 6 pupils received a series of workshops delivered by the local police as part of the Mini Police Scheme. The scheme provides a fun and interactive way to introduce children to a positive experience of policing and to get them involved in the local community. The aim is to help the children build confidence and learn new skills and to develop their sense of social justice and moral responsibility, safety and policing through a fun and engaging programme of activities. It is also delighted to give the children the opportunity to positively engage with their local community policing team. The Mini Police programme links in with the statutory Key Stage 2 requirements of Personal, Social, Health, Economic (PSHE) education.



HOW DO WE BREATH AND WHY OUR LUNGS ARE SO IMPORTANT? Last week, as part of their science learning, our Yr6 had a visit from a parent, Dr Susheela Banerji who talked to the children about how the lungs work and how disease can affect this part of the body. The children learned what can cause lung disease and also how, through history, lung disease has been caused by the work environment. The children were able to investigate models of the human body, including the bronchial tubes, to see how lung disease can affect breathing. One comment from the children was, 'It would be cool to be a doctor!' and another said that, 'It was fun having a go at trying to pronounce the long words.' A great way to learn as well as be inspired! Perhaps we may see some of our Perran-ar-Worthal pupils as doctors in the future.
